- 1. Update and revise water use projections with utilities (in process with the sub committee)
- 2. Engagement of the public with this process what, when, how, who
- 3. Engagement of public officials (pertinent municipalities) to promote the plan when we get to the public comment period and beyond
- 4. Identify and engage stakeholders that are not involved in the basin council, but have an overlapping or adjacent connection to our efforts. For example: NRCS, SC Forestry, SCEMD, etc. (SCDNR e-mails state and federal agencies ahead of each council meeting)
- 5. Development and maintenance of a public facing data clearinghouse for all things water with the Saluda Basin
- 6. Hydrological impairment on the Saluda, acknowledgement of this within the final report and within our recommendations

- 7. Funding for implementation
- 8. Report on which watersheds have watershed based plans and the status of those plans (this will be documented in Chapter 1 of the Plan)
- 9. We have discussed some data gaps making sure we acknowledge those in our final report and determine how to mitigate those in the future
- 10. If we want to request additional surface water demand scenarios we need to decide when? (ideally, before we start Phase 3, but could be as late as midway through Phase 4, per CDM Smith)
- 11. Determine how and when we will coordinate with other basin councils
