Meeting Summary (March 13th)

Jill Miller, USRBC Chair, called the March 13th meeting of the Upper Savannah RBC to order at 10:08 AM. The eighth meeting of the Upper Savannah RBC was held in-person and virtually via the Zoom virtual meeting platform. Including the Upper Savannah RBC members and planning team, there were 42 people present at this RBC meeting in-person and online. Jill discussed the agenda items for the meeting. The Upper Savannah RBC approved the RBC meeting agenda and the minutes and summary documents from February. A public comment period was held with no comments received. An agency comment period was held with no comments received. Ashley Reid reviewed the February meeting highlights.

Jeff Allen, Clemson University, presented *An Economic Analysis of Low Water Levels in Lake Hartwell* to the RBC members. The research question focused on changing lake levels and if it had measurable economic impacts on the six counties that border Lake Hartwell. The six counties were: Anderson, Oconee, Pickens, Franklin, Hart, and Stephens Counties and the grant was funded by the USACE with matching funds from the counties.

John Boyer presented the preliminary 2070 moderate and high demand scenario results and also reviewed updated UIF, current use, and permitted and registered scenarios with the RBC members. John reviewed model updates since January. John reviewed the scenario results for current use (no shortages), permitted and registered (four shortages), 2070 moderate demand (no shortages), 2070 high demand (three shortages), and reservoir plots for Lakes Keowee and Hartwell.

Finally, the RBC members received a short presentation from John Boyer and Ashley Reid to introduce water management strategies. After the introduction to water management

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strategies the RBC members were divided into groups for a group breakout session to discuss strategies for the Upper Savannah river basin.

The meeting concluded with Ashley Reid and John Boyer discussing the next Upper Savannah RBC meeting which will be held at the Starr Iva water district office. The meeting will be held April 10, 2024.
